What do you think about the Danish school system?

It is very good. Especially my Gymnasium. There are plenty of opportunities and I had the opportunity to study almost the same subjects that I studied in Italy. For example Math, chemistry, biology and physics. Here in Denmark, I also have Germany and Danish, which I didn't, study in Italy. My school in Italy is a bit different from my Gymnasium here in Denmark.

How is the school in Italy different from your school in Denmark?

In Italy, the school is from Monday to Saturday from 8:00-13:00 every day, but here in Denmark we go to school from Monday to Friday. My schedule changes every day, some days I'm off at noon and other days I'm off later in the afternoon at 16:00. I'm going to miss having the Saturday off when I'm back in Italy.

What do you think about the environment at your school in Denmark?

The environment here is very nice. I like that we at this school have a big canteen with space to sit down and do the homework, spending time on assignments or eating lunch with friends. Also, as I said earlier this school gives the students a lot of opportunities, for example, it has two big gyms, one small gym, a huge football field outside and music lessons with all kinds of different instruments. My school offers a big variety.

Why should exchange students chose to come to Denmark?

The schools in Denmark are very good and offers many different opportunities. In Italy, we are very much theoretical, but here in Denmark, I had the opportunity to be more practical. For example, I study math, chemistry, and physics on a high level and we are doing many experiments and are looking into the details of the experiment to learn: what and why is it happening. It's really inspiring and educational to be more practical at school and therefore I'm considering coming back to study at the university.

Why should a family host an exchange student?

It is a great experience to welcome someone in your life and, the families can learn a lot from the student and so can the student from the family. My thoughts about it are also, that the families will get to know someone that most likely is going to be a part of their lives in the coming years. I hope we will be in contact afterword because it is a great experience and it is very educational.
